Exciting News!

We are delighted to announce that one of our Trust schools, Ladock, have been successful in their application to the Tesco 'Bags of Help Grant Scheme.' The project, along with two other successful projects in our region, will go forward to a vote in Tesco stores during May and June 2017 where customers will decide the outcome by voting for their favourite project each time they shop.

Ladock will find out by the end of July 2017 the amount of funding they will receive. The project with the highest number of votes across our region will receive up to £4,000, the second placed project up to £2,000 and the third placed project £1,000.

The project is called, 'Outdoor Play at Ladock School' but might also be listed under St Piran's Cross MAT. The funding received would enable the school to develop their outdoor environment including Early Years play equipment as well as developing an outdoor reflection area.

We would be incredibly grateful if you could vote for Ladock's project and encourage all of your friends and family to do the same.

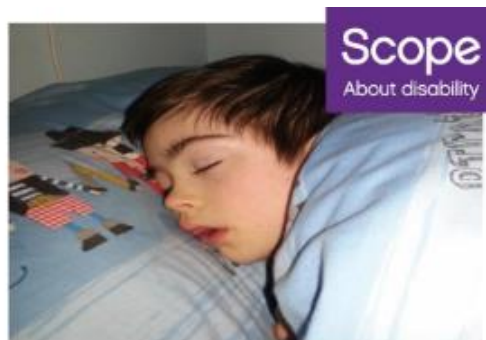
