# **National Bug Busting Day!**

Head lice are an ongoing issue in all schools and, to address the problem, we are taking part in the national 'Bug Busting Day'. This is a whole school approach and involves parents and carers checking their children's hair on a designated day- this

year's date is **Tuesday 31st January**.

The good news is, Bug Busting does not rely on expensive products or lotions containing pesticides and the technique is promoted as a safe and effective solution to treating head lice. It works by combining a specially designed comb with your usual shampoo and conditioner. With many schools across the country taking part on the same date, we hope that a synchronised approach will help to prevent the circulation of these sneaky pests!

#### So what happens now...?

Now that you have been given notice, please add this date to your diary and set aside time to check your children's hair on **Tuesday 31**<sup>st</sup> **January**.

To bring a little fun to what can be an embarrassing subject, we are inviting children to do something 'whacky' with their hair... the interpretation of this we leave down to you! Your child will also be given a free bug busting comb they can take home that evening.



### Wet Combing
