Parent Forum Feedback

Thank you to the 12 parents who attended our Parent Forum on Wednesday. They were joined by Mr Lees, Miss Goodall and Mrs Michell. This was a magnificent turn out, Mr Lees reported that it was the best across the trust! A summary of the points discussed is to be found below:

• Nursery places – Miss Goodall explained how the nursery places are allocated and how the reception and nursery children work together. The nursery is growing in popularity and sessions are now full.

- Classes for September 2016 Mr Lees explained that a class structure will be presented to the Trust's Finance Committee on Thursday 12th May. Once this has been agreed, (and this will depend on the budget available) parents will be informed of this structure and the teachers teaching each class.
- **Progress and learning** most parents at the Forum were pleased with the progress their children were making and the way the school was tailoring the education to fit each child. Year 1 parents were pleased with the work their children were doing in the mornings and could see great improvement. They also confirmed that the children had enjoyed the boat challenge connected to the value of trust.
- Playground at the end of the day a long discussion took place about the changes that had taken place on the playground at the end of the day. Although parents were disappointed that these changes had had to be made, they understood the safeguarding reasons for it and were happy that Mrs Michell has reflected on the decision and brought in 'Open Playground Thursday'.
- PFA the PFA is short of members and we are hoping that lots of new parents will join the committee and help raise much needed funds for Veryan School. Information to follow in next week's newsletter.
- PE one parent explained how one of the other



MAT schools has adopted the '**run a mile**' each day and this was really benefitting the children with their fitness and concentration levels. Mrs Michell agreed that this would be discussed by the staff. She also said that the children should receive around two hours PE/Sport per week.

- Parent and community support with sports

 the staff were kindly informed that there are many people in the community that are able, talented and willing to help with sports and other extra –curricular activities. Mrs Michell will request expressions of interest in the Veryan School News. We very much appreciate this being shared with the new members of staff at school who are keen to maintain and rebuild community links.
- Summer Show/Concert parents asked if this is to going to happen, it is and the dates will be 6th and 7th July Parents requested that the younger children did not spend hours in rehearsals when they were not needed. Mrs Michell and Mr Lees noted this point.
- Times tables one grandparent said that he thought it would be better if the children learnt their times tables by rote. A long discussion took place about this and effective methods of supporting the children. One parent said that the game 'knowing your times tables' was a great way for helping her children to learn them.
- Support with After School Clubs- one brilliant idea from the Parent Forum meeting was that we put a 'shout out' for parents and friends who might have a particular skill, talent or simply just enthusiasm that they could offer to support our After School Clubs. If you feel you have something you could offer, please speak to Mrs Allan in the office.

Key Stage 2 SATS Week

The Key Stage 2 SATS will take place next week following the timetable set below. This can be a very anxious time for children (not to mention staff and parents!) so I am sure we will all want to join together to wish our children luck.

On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday Miss Moore has kindly offered to run a FREE breakfast club which will be held in Kiberick classroom. This will start at 8am and is for year 6 pupils to give them the opportunity to have a good breakfast and some social time before the SATs begin. They can also ask any last minute questions. This is not compulsory but we would welcome any year 6s that would like to come. Please let us know if your year 6 child would like to come but is unable to get to school at this time.Our usual breakfast club will continue as normal from 8am in Kiberick 2.

If you are a parent of a year 6 child, please make sure your child goes to bed early and arrives at school on time in the morning having had a good breakfast (if they are not attending the school SATs breakfast club.) Whilst we want to encourage them all to do their best, we must try to avoid making them feel under pressure. The tests are just an opportunity for our children to show their hard work throughout their primary education, the results of which will help ensure they are in the correctly pitched group when they start at secondary school.

The SATS test will take place in Kiberick classroom and while the tests are taking place, year 5 children will work with Mrs Hawkins in Kiberick 2. Mr Lees will administer the tests while Miss Moore will work with those children entitled to one to one prompting.

Children are often keen to bring in a lucky mascot which we will allow but would appreciate your support in encouraging them to bring ONE item which is SMALL! They can also bring their own pens and pencils if they wish, but they will not be able to have a pencil case with them (unless it is transparent). All the resources they need will be provided.
