Parent Forum

Thank you to the many parents who attended our immersive curriculum open afternoon and then stayed on for a parent forum.



The discussions at parent forum focused on two areas:

School structure and staffing from September 2017

- Parents were generally grateful that the Trust had shared plans for the class structure and staffing of the school for September 2017 so early. They appreciated that other changes may occur before we reach September 2017 but were pleased with the open and transparent approach to the changes at this stage.
- Mr Lees confirmed that the new Head of School appointment was proceeding and that interviews would be taking place on 5th May 2017 at Veryan





School. He confirmed that there had already been some promising interest in this post. He also reiterated that the Head would be a class teacher for Year 4,5 and 6 for most of the week. The new Head will be supported by Mrs Michell for 1.5 days per week.

- Some parents were concerned that the nursery provision offer would only be for the mornings. Mrs Michell confirmed that this would be the case during the autumn term 2017, but if enough parents wanted whole day and were paying for sessions we would reconsider this, however, there would have to be a sufficient take up of nursery places to make it sustainable.
- We will also be appointing a PE Assistant apprentice who will also support classes during the morning.
- Mr Lees confirmed that as new staff are appointed we would inform parents and provide opportunities during the summer term to meet them.
- Mrs Michell reminded parents that our class sizes during the morning in September 2017 remained small and that we remained the only small school on the Roseland that offered three classes for the core subjects.

The School Field

Parents asked whether we could make better use of Veryan's School field. Mr Lees said that this was a very fair point and he would look into it.
