Introducing our new MAT Senior Leadership Team

Mr Stuart Renshaw – CEO

I started my career in teaching at a very large school in Wembley, North London in the mid 1980s, I quickly moved through the ranks and moved to Leicestershire in 1993 to take up the position as



Deputy Head of a very large school in Loughborough. This four term maternity cover gave me great insight into working in a large primary school. I then moved on to a permanent Deputy Head position before becoming a substantive Headteacher of a small school. I was joined for the five years at the school by my two youngest children: in a school of 60 pupils times were interesting! During this time I was an adviser for the Local Authority's Investors in People strategy and I trained to be a church school inspector.

It was in 2005 that I made my way to Cornwall to become the Headteacher of St Petroc's School in Bodmin. During my time there the school became part of the Saints' Way Multi-Academy Trust and I became the Executive Principal: I think more by the fact that none of my colleagues at the time wanted the responsibility! Seriously, I was honoured to take on the role and work across all the schools in the Trust striving to get the best outcomes for our children. I am a member of the Diocese of Truro Board of Education and I sit as a member of the Cornwall Association of Primary Headteachers.

Having just completed my CEOs training with the Church of England Foundation for Leadership I feel equipped to rise to the challenge of uniting our schools in education. The future is very exciting and I think we are in for some great times ahead. I really want to focus on two principle aims: to build strong relationships and to develop a growing confidence in all leaders and learners. I believe this will enable us to support every one of the 2000 children we will have in the merged Trust. I am very much looking forward to engaging with all the schools and meeting the children who lie at the very heart of all we do.

Fiona Corfield – School Improvement Lead

What is your lasting memory of your time at school? I remember when I took my options at secondary school, I was really keen to learn French. Two weeks in my teacher approached me and



said, 'Do you know. I think you'd be better suited to needlework!' I was devastated but, I did end my time at secondary school with a really nice gingham apron! This experience helped to cement my educational beliefs and vision, that high quality education is about recognising every child's potential, empowering them to believe in themselves as successful learners by providing exciting challenges and opportunities, where learning how to learn is as important as what they learn.

My teaching career began in a village school as a Key Stage One teacher and Early Years Coordinator in Shropshire. In 1998 I took up the position of Early Years Raise Adviser for Shropshire Local Education Authority with responsibility for consultancy and training for the Foundation Stage, in the maintained and nonmaintained sectors, and Key Stage One. In 2002, I became an independent educational consultant, specialising in early years and Primary education, working closely with local authorities nationally and schools in the UK and in Milan. During this time I worked with members of the DfE to deliver national training to Local Authorities across the country, wrote articles for educational periodicals, was invited to give keynote speeches at LA and national conferences and wrote a number of publications, some of which sold internationally.

In 2007, I returned to teaching and became the head teacher of a large primary school in the Midlands. In 2010, we moved to Cornwall and I became the Teaching Head at Lerryn CE Primary School. If you've ever been to Lerryn you'll know what an idyllic setting it is with a tidal creek and beautiful woodland. Following this I then became Executive Head of Lerryn and St Winnow CofE Primaries and in 2013 took up the post of School Improvement Lead for The Saints' Way Multi Academy Trust.

I am really delighted to have the opportunity to work alongside St Piran's Cross. Working together we can enable every child to become successful independent learners. Because every child has the right to sparkle and shine!
