Cold weather routine or other emergencies

At this point of the year as the weather begins to turn colder it is worth reiterating our cold weather and emergency closures plans.

There may also be a need for a part closure if some members of our staff cannot travel safely into our schools.

In the event of severe weather or another emergency we would follow this procedure:

- We will inform the local radio stations that the school will not be open.
- We will place an information notice on the front page of the school website with the latest information.
- We will text all parents with our intention to close the school.
- A board will be placed at the school entrance to inform people arriving.
- The phones will be manned by staff who live in close proximity to the school.
- If we have to close the school during the working day we will telephone all parents, and staff who live in close proximity to the school will look after them until the children are collected.

We hope that this will not be necessary but it is better to be prepared and warned!

Punctuality – Register 9.00am

Punctuality and attendance is an important element to the life of our school. Children are welcome into the playground from 8.30am and are encouraged to line up and come into school with their whole class using the bottom door in the playground. Ideally all children would then be able to participate in Morning Maths from 8:45am each

day. Morning maths gives us the opportunity to support our children with their practise of basic skills, such as number bonds and multiplication tables. Non-attendance of this valuable session could have a negative impact on their maths progress.

Our regular visits from the Education Welfare Officer take into account any persistent absentees or late arrivals. Your child's class will have daily registration at 9.00am. If your child arrives after 9.05am your child will be marked as late. Please be aware that you may be asked about the reasons why your child is late. Thank you for your ongoing support in this matter.

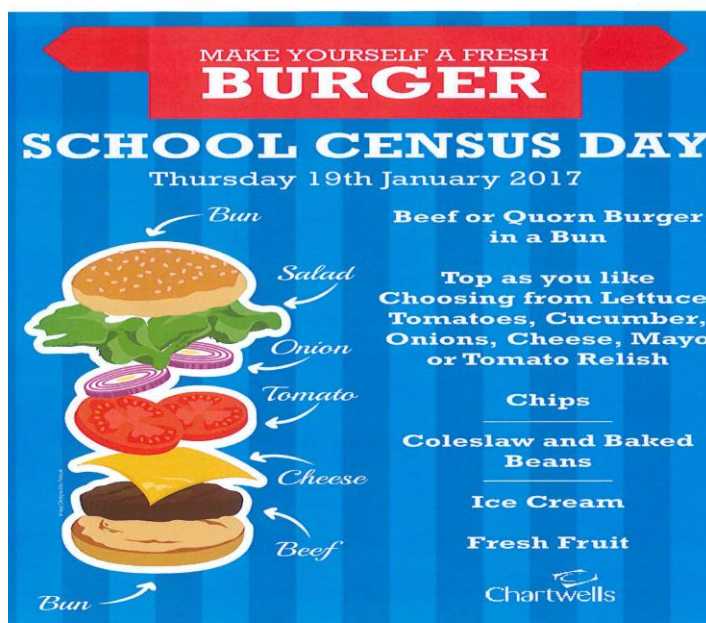


School Applications

LawStuff.org has been designed to enable visitors to find out their legal rights in a way which is easy to navigate and understand. For optimum accessibility a pop up glossary has also been added to the website to help explain complex legal terms.

The website also hosts the popular publication *At what age can I?* Here, young people can find out what activities they can do at certain ages such as, "when can I learn to drive?", "when can I babysit?" and "when can I leave home?"
