


After School Club 'Friday Funhouse'

Kiberick's Science experiment

Class Mission:

Design and build a landing vehicle for an Eggnaut (an egg) to land on a simulated Martian surface. It is a simulation of landing a rover on the surface of Mars safely by overcoming challenges like slowing down it's speed and avoiding the bumps on the rough surface of Mars.











How to Protect Our Eggnaut

The children were given materials and the Mission and asked to design a craft that would protect a hard boiled egg when dropped from 2.5 m in height. Kiberick went through planning and collaboration in groups, designing and predicting and finally testing and evaluating—only 1 team managed to create a design that didn't result in a cracked egg!!
