
Free School Meals and Universal Free School Meals should still be booked in advance and at the point of payment will show a £0.00 balance to pay.

Summer Food Fund

Children currently eligible for Free School Meals, that have been receiving Edenred vouchers since school closure will now also receive one voucher code worth £90.00 per child to cover the summer holiday period. This will be sent via the same system as previous vouchers before the holidays resume.

Please note: These will need to be used in the first 4 weeks as they expire after 1 month from activation.

Amazingly, Waddle and the gang were looked after very well by the boy.





They were happy to go into a huge container with places to hide and all the things they liked from the wild. Josh fed them and cleaned their water every day and they were grateful for this.

Sandwiches are not just for eating—we used them for learning about equivalent fractions this week too!















Fredster produced a map of different places where gold can be found....





Amy's work about the California Gold Rush






Charlie designed a Minecraft landscape with different ore components.




