

School drop off and collection

We have become aware of more and more children coming straight into the school building in the morning and entering through the reception area to drop off bags/ equipment etc. As teaching staff may be yet to arrive, busy preparing activities and lessons, or on the playground themselves, it is imperative that ALL children go straight to the school playground in the morning from 8:30am and do not enter

school from the main top door.

It is a safeguarding matter to have children moving around the school building without supervision, but also to have parents/carers without relevant DBS checks in the classrooms/corridors when there are no members of staff around.

If you need to pass a message to a member of staff you may be able to see them briefly on the school playground before they lead their class in to school or please speak to, email or phone Mrs Allan in the office who can pass on your message to the relevant teacher.

We also want to encourage the children's independence and sense of self. Families and school can support this by encouraging children to socialise and meet on the playground in the morning and enter the school building with their peers as a whole class.

If your child has a musical instrument that they need to bring into school to prevent possible damage in the playground, these can be handed in to be kept safe in the school office until the scheduled lesson time.

As always, if you need to arrange an appointment to speak to your class teacher please contact the school office to arrange a convenient meeting outside of teaching time.

Another safeguarding issue of concern is at the end of the school day, when children are dismissed by the class teacher, families remain in the school playground/use the play equipment.

When staff have dismissed your child to you at the top end of the playground, please can we ask that you promptly leave the playground area and keep your children with you. We understand that children and parents like to be able to socialise at this time, but it means that any after school clubs wishing to use the playground for activities are unable to have unrestricted use, and in terms of safeguarding it is often difficult for staff to be clear on which child has been safely dismissed to a parent with so many children running back into the playground, with the addition of potential accidents from the playground equipment. Therefore, we would like to ask that all parents and children have vacated the playground by 3.30pm at which point staff will lock the main gate. (On Monday's staff have to attend a staff meeting at Grampound With Creed School and will need to lock the gates immediately after children are dismissed.

Norovirus From Public Health: Normally by this time of the year we see very few cases of norovirus but this year we have had several outbreaks over the past few weeks. No-

rovirus causes viral gastroenteritis, which is characterised by the sudden onset of vomiting and/or diarrhoea, it can spread rapidly in closed environments such as schools.

- Norovirus is generally a mild infection and people usually recover fully within 2-3 days.
 No specific treatment is needed, but it is important to keep hydrated by drinking fluids as tolerated.
- Norovirus is highly infectious and spreads easily from person to person, especially in close knit communities such as schools, therefore, we are asking for your help to prevent further illness within the school by following the advice in the checklist below:
- Staff and pupils/children who develop symptoms of diarrhoea and/or vomiting should stay away from school/nursery and other childcare settings such as childminders until they have been symptom free for at least 48 hours.
- Good hygiene is important to stop the spread of infection, especially hand washing, frequently and thoroughly with soap and water, particularly after using the toilet and before eating or handling food.
- Good hygiene in the home will also help prevent spread to other family members. If possible separate toilets and towels should be used. Toilets, including seats and handles, as well as door handles, wash basins and other frequently touched surfaces should be cleaned and disinfected frequently.
- If symptoms do not resolve after 48 hours or if you are concerned please contact your GP by phone or contact the NHS non-emergency number 111.
