You will see from your class Dojo messages and in this newsletter this week ,that the children have been extremely busy making the most of the outdoors whilst the weather remains on our side (mostly!)

We were fortunate on Wednesday to hold our Remembrance service in a spot of autumn sunshine; despite having to make a few alterations to the usual proceedings, the service was beautiful. Kiberick class children led the service with readings and prayer and all the classes behaved impeccably throughout.

Each class took some time throughout the day to visit the memorial cross in the village to pay their respects. Kiberick children painted stones with the addition of the name of each fallen soldier on the reverse which they read aloud as they laid their stones. Pendower and Carne class made their own poppies which they 'planted' around the memorial. I was very impressed with all the children's attitudes and we have had some more lovely comments from our local community about the children and the school which we should be very proud of.

I have been asked to kindly request that parents encourage our children to be respectful of the area at pick up and drop off times and dissuade children from playing or climbing on the memorial cross, but I do hope you'll be able to look with your children at the poppies and stones we laid and the wreaths that have been placed by school and other local community members.

Kiberick class made memorial stones and laid them at the foot of the memorial cross. You can see their video on the class and RE pages on the school website.




Remembrance 2020 Our whole school safely came together for readings, prayer, reflection and remembrance on Wednesday morning. We were very proud of all the children.
