#### **Learning with Carne Class...**

Thinking about nutrition and what living things need to stay alive while strengthening our hand muscles by cutting up vegetables..



We absolutely loved preparing for our space adventure with you all. Making space cakes to eat and presenting what we have learned to you. Thank you for coming, it was out of this world!











#### Learning with Carne Class...

In maths we have been measuring using cubes, comparing sizes and ordering numbers as well as halving, doubling and distinguishing between greater and fewer.



In art we have been learning how to do observational drawings of animals from the UK and will be continuing to practice our skills inspired by the animal kingdom this term.





#### Learning with Kiberick...

This term in geography Kiberick are learning about mapping and noticing human and physical features in the environment. To launch this, we went for a walk around the local area and had a go at creating sketch maps of the school and its surrounding area. Following this, we have been learning skills which will enable us to create more detailed maps in the coming weeks. We learnt how to follow 8 point compass directions, how to use grid references, up to six figures and what symbols are recognized and used by ordinance survey maps. Additionally, we have begun our new RE questions — What do Christians believe Jesus did to save people? — we looked at the Easter story closely and created drama or art to represent each part.



We had Pengelley Garden Centre in, to continue with our project to develop and update our gardening space. They worked with Carne Class first who learned how to sprout seeds and about the nutrients within microgreens. They each planted microgreens and them some peas which will go together to form a climbing trellis.

Kiberick were next and they learned about vegetable families and played a game of 'guess my vegetable'. They created a plan for a vegetable plot in our gardening area using the 'square foot gardening' principle. Then the children planted a large selection of seeds in readiness for transferring to our gardening plot after Easter.

We are all so excited to see our garden developing!



# Why is Year 6 being weighed and measured?

The school nursing team is visiting Year 6!


We are going to measure the weight and height of Year 6 pupils as part of our work to help keep the nation healthy.

#### Did you know?

- Children are weighed and measured when they are babies, and again in Reception and Year 6.
- It helps the government see how healthy the nation is, and plan health and leisure services for children.
- It's a good chance to check how you're developing and think about ways you can become healthier.

#### What will happen?

- You will be measured one at a time in private.
- All you need to do is take your shoes off – it will be really quick!
- Only your parents or carers will see the results – not your teachers or friends.



#### Top tips for a healthier you

Everyone can find ways to be healthier - what can you do today?

#### 1. 5 a day

Try to eat five portions and a variety of fruit and veg every day.



#### 2. cut back fat

Try and keep foods like crisps, buns, cakes, pastries and biscuits as occasional treats only.



#### watch the salt

Check the label and choose foods lower in salt and try not to add salt, to your food.



#### 4. sugar swaps

Swap sugary drinks for water, lower-fat milks, no-added-sugar or sugar-free drinks.



#### 5. get going every day

Spend at least 60 minutes walking, playing sport, running around or being active every day.



#### 6. me size meals

Children need smaller portions than grown ups. Start with a smaller amount of food on your plate, then ask for more if you are still hungry.





#### Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals the criteria and link you will need to follow are below. Not only would your child receive free meals but this enables the school to access additional funding. If you would apply by post please contact the office for a paper application form.

#### Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are not eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

Working Tax Credit

Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance


