




#### Playground Safety and Safeguarding

Please can we remind all parents and carers that once your child has been dismissed to you at the end of the school day your children should not be allowed to return to the school playground beyond the green gate/fencing.

We need to ensure that all children are safely under the supervision of whoever collected them and are not using the playground equip-



Following a review of our safety and safeguarding procedures at drop off and collection, we have been advised that all children should be brought into school and collected using the one main entrance/exit in the playground. Therefore, the side gate by the village hall will now remain locked.

Finally, it has been brought to our attention that children are digging and removing rocks from perimeter fencing and walls. Please do not allow your child to dig or play with the rocks and stones—they are very sharp and can cause injury, but it also undermines the integrity of the structures and causes damage to our premises.


