MAT Attendance Policy

"Missing education leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Regular school attendance plays a key role in effective safeguarding. All schools must have robust procedures in place for pupil admission, ongoing attendance and punctuality." (Achieving High Attendance 2016, Cornwall Council).

At Celtic Cross Education, we aim for an environment which enables and encourages all members of the community to strive for excellence. For our children to gain the greatest benefit from their education, it is vital that they attend school regularly and your child should be at school, on time every day, unless the reason for the absence is unavoidable.

Why regular attendance is important? Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning. Any pupil's absence disrupts teaching routines, and so, may affect the learning of others in the same class.

How close are you to reaching the top? Ensuring your child's regular attendance at school is your legal responsibility and permitting absence from school without a good reason creates an offence in law and may result in prosecution.

> As part of our Trust policy we will be sending home more frequent attendance reports to help you keep track of your child's attendance. You will shortly receive your child's attendance report as part of our ongoing commitment to improve Veryan School's attendance and to ensure that every child is given the best possible chance to meet their full potential. School emergency closures

A guide for parents / carers

We recognise that the decision to close a school in the event of an emergency (e.g. snow, flooding, no water or heating) significantly impacts upon you, as parents / carers. This guide outlines the agreed procedure which all schools are asked to follow and offers advice to parents / carers on the key things to consider, both before and after the decision to close has been made.

Guidance given to schools

Guidance and procedures are sent to all schools on an annual basis, usually at the start of the autumn term. To prevent the possibility of fraudulent school closures, schools are required to follow a verification process before providing school closure information. Schools are then asked to:

Undertake a risk assessment, using common sense to determine whether it is feasible for children and staff to remain in the school; and if not, what subsequent risks could arise by sending them home. Before school hours start, schools are also asked to assess if the roads are safe for children to travel to school.

Seek approval from the Governing Board (usually the decision of the Chair of Governors will suffice) to authorise the decision to close.

Notify Cornwall Council and the three local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Heart FM and Pirate FM). Providing the school follow the agreed procedure, each of the radio stations have all agreed to broadcast details of all school closures.

We will publish a list of current school closures on the Cornwall Council website at www.cornwall.gov.uk/schoolclosures and on our social media channels.

Know your school's procedure

Although schools are asked to follow this procedure, schools should have their own plan of action to be followed in the event of a closure. This should include details of how parents will be notified (e.g. via radio, text message, social media, etc). It is essential that schools communicate their plan to all parents as early as possible, and equally that all parents familiarise themselves with the agreed plan.

Who to contact

If the decision is made to close, you will be notified by the school's agreed notification procedure. Should you need to contact the school directly, please be aware that the line(s) may be busy or unavailable when a large number of parents are calling at the same time.

If the decision is made to close the school before the start of the school day a text message will be sent out as soon as confirmation of this decision is made. The local radio stations will be informed, along with Cornwall Council. Our school website scrolling bulletin will also display the information.
