It is an introduction to some top tips and strategies and incorporates golden threads from our other Parenting programs. It is an introduction to positive behaviour management that often gives those who attend confidence to engage with other support on offer. RecRoomis a sociai hangoutgame, where users meet up with friends to explore and createrooms, each containing a differentexperience one room might be a game of laser tag or dodgebaill, while another could be a parkour course orvitual boxing; Available on ios devices, playstation, Xbox, Oculus and PC/Mac, Rec Room is KiASAFE COPPA Cerified and cairies an agerating of $9+$. Nonetheless, parents and carers shouldfemain mindfult that gaming online with strangers always carries a potentiairisk


Intirnidating Interactions
Rec Room is a huge online environment, with more than 10 million users worldwide. Before heading into the individual rooms, players usually mingle in the Rec Centre. Users can move their avatar around this social space and audio chat using their microphone. While most people just want to have fun and make friends, some may say and do things that others finduncomfortable, threateningor harmful.

## Online Bullying

As cliques can form naturally during a gamingsession situations could easily arise where some childrenfeel left out or even bullied. Gamers can victimise other players for no reason at all, andmany hide behind an online persona whic of fers asense of immunity from their actions. Even when players are banned, those determined enough can simply make another account and re-enter the garme.

## Questionable Connections

Adding someone as a friendis a good way to connect with a person you had fun with online. However, not everybody is who they seem, and some might have more sinister ideas once a triendship has beenestablished. When two players (who dortt have junior accounts) accepteach other as friends inRec Room, theyre able to chat privately, track each other in-game and plan togo intorcoms toge ther on their own.

## Violent or Scary Thernes

RecRoom contains mild violent or scary themes, including weapons like swords and paintball guns. It is quite tarne weapons like swords and paintbail guns. It is quite tarme impression on younger children. This applies evenmore when playing in virtual reality: VR significantly enhances an experien - playing in virtuad reailty: VR significantly enhances an experience on young ones whio may be upset by adult themes.

Some rooms have adult themes and absolutely should not be entered by children The garne's code of conduct stipulates that players must be warned about anything of this nature before entering a room, butusers who don't have a junior account could still potentially gain access. The major worry is that ayoung person could be lured into these rooms before realising whot goes on inside.


Junior users cant send or recelve audio and private messages or create their own room. Anybody under 13 is required to have d junior account, and those accounts are linked to (and moderatedby) aparent or guardian occount To create one, star a new game of Rec Room, go to Create an Account' andfollow the instructions. Be ure to explain the restrictions to your children before letting them play.

## Parenis \& Carers <br> Block and Report <br> 

Tohelp moderote problem users, selact the player (click the right thumb stick on PSA press T'on PC, point in VR, etc), The 'Comfort and Moderation screen presents options including block, unblock, votelickand report players you block will not be ollowed in the some room as you. The Rec Room website E code of conduct canhelp you decide whether aployer has violated the terms and should be reported.

## Tailor the Experience

Inthe settings (within the Watch Menur), you cantweak indlividual parts of the Rec Room experience. Averything from mutingother players audio, muting your mic and tweaking voice pitch, through to selecting how close other ployers can get to you can be found here This is ideal for people who prefer to ovoid socid interactions or simply want to enjoy the game without worrying about other players.

## Disable Payment Methods

Rec Roam is free to download and play, but there are in-game purchases - items like cosmetics and costumes - that users pay for with reai money if you hove a card attoched to any platform accounts (fike al Play station or Steam occount), be aware that children might therefore incurcosts on these without meaning to. It's safest to unlink any payment methods before you download the game

## Get Involved

As it's suchapopulargame there are lots of cantent creators on Youmbe and Twitch whose out put focuses on Rec Room. Most ofthis content is tailored to a younger oudience. Talking to your childabout their fovourite creators - and watching their videos together - is good way ofopening a dialogue obout your child's experiences in Rec Room and understonding which aspects of the game they enjoy.
