Sharing Veryan's learning...

Carne Class-

We learned about our school story The Good Samaritan. We decided to think of lots of ways we can help each other in our learning and in every day school life. We pinned these to our kindness tree. It was really exciting to see how quickly our tree got full up with all the kindness we showed each other!



We are busy repotting and caring for all our vegetable plants as part of our Stemtaprise project. We made supports for our peas using Willow and we are making sure the plants have everything they need, including lots of sunshine, by placing them in sunny spots in our playground, plenty of water, cosy and nutritious compost and of course, lots of LOVE!



"In Reception we have been practicing our writing using an activity called "Hold a Sentence". Miss Goodall says a sentence aloud and then we have to try and hold it in our memory and write it down using our sounds. We use the sounds on the wall and we use our Fred Fingers to help us work out the sounds in each word. We have to remember to put finger spaces between each word and put a full stop at the end. Miss Goodall is REALLY impressed with how well we all did!"

Your School Nurse

Your child can have access to a School Nurse at any time if you have any health concerns, in addition your School Nurse offers a full health assessment in reception and year 6.

The School Nurse can check:

- Your child is growing healthily and support with healthy eating
- Support with access to dental care and general support for dental hygiene
- Help with day / night time wetting or soiling
- Provide Information about Immunisations
- Guidance re healthy lifestyles
- Support with general hygiene issues including head lice and worms
- Support with general emotional health issues
- Support to access other health professionals
- Routines, including sleep

Additionally in Year 6:

- Friendships
- Relationships
- Development, Including periods and puberty
- Access to specialist services including dietician, healthy weight programmes and voluntary services
- Developmental Issues
- Transition to secondary school
- Healthy lifestyles

Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals the criteria and link you will need to follow are below. Not only would your child receive free meals but this enables the school to access additional funding. If you would apply by post please contact the office for a paper application form.

Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are not eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

Working Tax Credit

Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance
